Did you know? Studies show that **80%** of brain growth happens by the age of 3. Engaging in reading activities from birth gives our children the best opportunity to be proficient in reading by the end of third grade. Children who read proficiently by the end of third grade are four times more likely to graduate from high school, paving the way to higher education or having better opportunities in the workforce. United Way is building a layered approach to literacy starting with programs from birth to kindergarten



through programs like "The Basics", kindergarten through 2nd grade by providing literacy kits, and engaging in national programs like "Read United".

Did you know? United Way of Forsyth County activates hundreds of volunteers during the community wide *Day of Caring* event every year. In 2023, approximately *640* volunteers packaged *135,000* dried, non-perishable meals for *4* local food pantries. Volunteers also packaged *2,000* family snack packs, assembled *1,000* school supply kits, and assembled *300* literacy kits for Forsyth County students.

For many low to moderate income families and seniors, the costs associated with having their income taxes prepared can take a bite out of the income they need to support themselves and their families. United Way of Forsyth County and The AARP Tax Aide Program team up each tax season to provide FREE Income Tax preparation to assist low to moderate income families (those earning \$54,000 or less) and those individuals 60 years and older in Forsyth, Dawson and surrounding

counties. In 2023, **576** returns were prepared at no cost. Taxpayers received federal refunds totaling **\$489,566**, state refunds totaling **\$135,373**, and saved approximately **\$157,000** in filing fees. Free tax preparation supports the goal of VITA and United Way of Forsyth County to build financial stability for everyone in our community.

With the help of community volunteers and stakeholders, United Way of Forsyth County developed a mental health website which provides relevant information regarding mental wellness, mental illness, and resources to support improving mental health in Forsyth County. In collaboration with Forsyth County Schools, United Way of Forsyth County is invested in our students' overall health by providing funding for on-site therapeutic services to students when costs were more than the family could afford. In 2023, United Way paid out **\$37,081** to this program which equates to approximately **620** therapeutic sessions.

United Way of Forsyth County actively nurtures and models social behaviors that encourage and promote an inclusive, diverse, and equitable community. We improve lives by serving people without regard to race, gender, age, religion, sexual orientation, identity, ability, or familial status. Our ongoing commitment to an inclusive, diverse, and equitable community and expectation to improve

United Way of Forsyth County funds **Forsyth County Schools' Credit Recovery** program, which assists with tuition for recovery credits for failed classes, transportation for before and after school programs or tutoring, graduation fees and High School Graduation Test review sessions as well as other services to help keep students engaged and on track to graduate. These services are offered to students who are identified as economically disadvantaged, special needs or ELL students to remove any and all barriers they may experience getting in the way of on-time graduation. In 2023, United Way funded **\$50,364** to Credit Recovery programs which served Forsyth County students. Since 2008, United Way has funded **\$875,874** to Credit Recovery programs. Additionally, the graduation rate in Forsyth County has increased from **85.8%** in 2008 to **95.8%** in 2022. This is an increase of **10%**.

One of the most important resources we have is our partners. United Way is engaging people from business, government, nonprofits and ordinary citizens.
